Old Business in Progress

- Pressure Vessel Safety new Cam Lock design keeps the cam-lock attached if removed with tank under pressure. Proposal is to replace all existing cam-locks with the vent-lock safety system. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TsjmCSwHya8
 - a. Action Replace all existing cam-locks with new cam vent-lock safety system
 - b. Replace each unit when parts are available.
 - c. Contact Ed Divirgilio for parts.
 - d. Estimate Cost: \$17,000 \$20,000 approved

Incidents, Near Misses, Incident Analysis

- a. 4 TMA crashes in previous 30 days bringing the season total to 6
 - a. All TMA hits occurred on MDOT Jobs.
 - b. Higher prevalence of distracted, elderly, under-the influence drivers.
- b. 1 worker was struck by a motorist. The driver of the TMA that was struck this week had a mild injury.
- c. FMCSA Site A review of the site shows that simple acts like wearing your seatbelt and driving the speed limit will help keep PK below the intervention threshold.
- d. Safety Minute Discussion Recording, participating in the daily safety minute discussion has been clearly positive. Thank you for all of our field personnel for participating.

New Items

- CDL Train the trainer provide dates to send PK employee for CDL instructor training
 - a. Agreement that train the trainer would be valuable in the offseason. January is a possibility.
 - i. This is a week-long 40hour course intended for a person with an existing CDL-A to become certified to train others to get their CDL-A
 - b. During the discussion it was discovered that all divisions need more CDL drivers. Matt said that he is willing to take a person off the schedule for a week to have them trained to get their CDL.
 - c. Kyle Vandusen said that he is sending a PK Kalamazoo employee who currently has their CDL-C to a 1 week long course near Kalamazoo to get their CDL-A.
 - d. Although class curriculums and lengths may vary in time and cost it seems that one full week may be the standard for someone with a CDL-C with driving experience to obtain a CDL-A license administered by a certified trainer at a facility.
 - e. Proposed Tool Talk to communicate the written policy and PK subsidy for obtaining a CDL.
